Get Involved

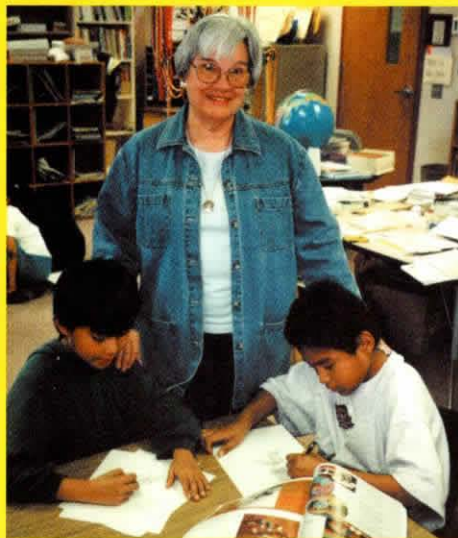
Everyone in the United States can participate in IYV 2001. Here are some ideas to get started:

Civic or Community Organizations

- Spread the word about IYV 2001 to others. Tell members, colleagues, government leaders, professional associations, volunteer groups and the media.
- Ask your governor or mayor to proclaim 2001 as the International Year of the Volunteer.
- Create a community volunteer award in honor of IYV 2001. Share the volunteer's story on the IYV 2001 U.S. Web site.
- Host a kick-off event on Dec. 5, 2000, or a culmination event on Dec. 5, 2001.

Families or Religious Groups

- Contact your local volunteer center to find out about volunteer opportunities available in your community.
- Pledge to serve a certain number of volunteer hours during 2001.
- Recognize a volunteer with a note of thanks, lunch or in some other special way.

Individuals

- Contribute experiences or stories as a volunteer with youth in classroom or club settings.
- Share your skills or expertise to increase volunteer involvement. Train new volunteers, be a speaker at an event, mentor a child, host a meeting, etc.
