The box cover and game board of VOLUNTEERS! are covered with photos of real-life volunteer situations across the country, making the game a fascinating and warm gift for volunteer recognition events, staff, and community leaders, as well as the training tool that was requested of FOUR-ONE-ONE by the volunteer community.
